

NIN to open food pantries in Methuen & Andover

Neighbors in Need is excited to announce the opening of two new food pantries in the Greater Lawrence area. In October, we will be opening a pantry at the Methuen Public Schools Family Resource Center at 10 Ditson Place in Methuen. This is our second Methuen food pantry and currently our only evening pantry. Later in the year we will be opening our first pantry in Andover.

Both of these pantries have come about after months of planning and hard work by community leaders in both Methuen and Andover, and Neighbors in Need staff and Board members. Additionally, the Greater Boston Food Bank has supported this initiative with a Capacity Building grant targeting underserved areas.

For months Julie Little, The Savings Bank's Methuen Branch Manager and Neighbors in Need board member, encouraged Neighbors in Need to bring a pantry to her community. She spread the word about Neighbors in Need in Methuen, and engaged other community leaders about the hungry and the need for an additional food pantry. Those conversations have led to a wonderful partnership between Neighbors in Need, Methuen Public Schools and First Church Congregational. Key to this partnership are Judy Scannell, the Superintendent of Methuen Public Schools and Bill Ingraham, Senior Pastor at First Church Congregational. While the pantry will be held in the Methuen Public Schools Family Resource Center, volunteers from First Church Congregational will staff the pantry. Neighbors in Need also has the support of Methuen Rotary and Exchange Club, Holy Family Hospital, Methuen YMCA and many others.

While finalizing our plans to open our new Methuen pantry this month, we've also been working with Annmary Connor, Andover's Director of Elder Services to open our first-ever pantry in the town of Andover. Ever since working with Andover School Lunch Rescue group, Neighbors in Need has been looking for a way to distribute food to the hungry in Andover. And we are well on our way to opening this site stay tuned for more news about this exciting opportunity in the coming months.

Neighbors in Need helps families with diapers & formula

THERE IS A GROWING PROBLEM...





Diapers cost \$18 per week, or \$936 per year, on average per child; Babies need 6-10 diapers a day



U.S. moms suffer from diaper need

AND, IT HAS A NEGATIVE IMPACT ON MOMS AND CHILDREN...

Diaper need is even more distressing to moms than not having enough food for their family



Women with diaper need also reported more difficulty with stress management, depression and coping with trauma – which can negatively affect a child's health and development

Children in soiled diapers are exposed to greater health risks
